How Do I Know If My Child May Benefit From Early Intervention Services?

The early years are important to a child's development and no two children develop at the same rate. Help is available to all eligible children ages 3 to 5 years old through public school early intervention preschool programs.

Most preschoolers should be able to perform the following age-appropriate skills:

Age 3

Responds to simple directions
Is potty trained
Jumps in place
Points to 3 colors
Draws a circle
Runs

Age 4

Counts four objects
Climbs stairs independently
Names four basic colors
Knows age and full name
Plays with other children
Tells a story
Completes simple puzzles

Age 5

Carries on a conversation
Recites the alphabet
Uses scissors
Recognizes own printed name
Dresses self
Bounces and catches large ball

If I Think My Child May Have Developmental Delays, What Should I Do?

Contact Children's Academy Early Learning Center at 812-542-5506 to request an educational evaluation when your child is between the ages of 3 to 5 years old.

If your child is under the age of three, he or she may be eligible for other early intervention programs. For more information, contact First Steps at 1-800-941-2450.

What Determines Eligibility for Preschool Intervention?

A multidisciplinary educational evaluation will be performed by the NAFCS Early Intervention Specialists. Following this evaluation, a Case Conference Committee that includes parents, a school representative, and early intervention specialists will determine special education eligibility. If the child is found eligible for services, an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), outlining the services a child will need to succeed will be created. The following are disabling conditions for eligibility:

- Developmental Delay
- Language or Speech Impairment
- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Blind or Low Vision
- Deaf or Hard of Hearing
- Cognitive Disability
- **Emotional Disability**
- Multiple Disabilities
- Orthopedic Impairment
- Other Health Impairment
- Specific Learning Disability
- Traumatic Brain Injury

What Services Will Be Provided By Public Schools? Following the Case Conference where the Ind

Following the Case Conference where the Individual Education Plan (IEP) is developed, the following services may be available with appropriate eligibility:

- Early Intervention Preschool
- Speech and Language Therapy
- Occupational and/or Physical Therapy
- Other available services: nurse, vision and hearing specialists

What Programs Are Available Through the Public School System?

Following the development of the IEP, with consideration to the least restrictive environment, services may be provided in one of the following settings:

- Early intervention classrooms located at the Early Learning Center
- Early Learning Center
 Collaboration with Floyd County Head Start
- Walk-in Speech Therapy program

Does My Child Have Any Legal Rights?

Yes. Children have the right to access special education services. Although schools are required to provide services to eligible children, parents are not required to enroll a preschool aged child in a special education program. Parents will be provided a copy of their legal rights at the time their child is referred for an evaluation.
