WHAT IS CASA?

CASAs, or Court Appointed Special Advocates, are volunteers that give a voice to the most vulnerable children in our community. Appointed by a judge, these advocates represent children in Child in Need of Services (CHINS) cases which involve abuse and/or neglect. Volunteers report and represent the child's best interests and wishes to assist the court in making a sound decision about that child's future. CASAs advocate for children in some of the most vulnerable and consequential moments of their young lives. The desired result is that these children are placed in safe, permanent, and nurturing homes where they can thrive.
