- 3. We chose ten (10) applicants who met the requirements of this position.
- 4. We held our first round of interviews on January 30, 2024 and February 1, 2024. The following people served on the Interview Committee:
 - a. Dr. Michelle Ginkins, Dr. Travis Madison, Jamie Crick, Don Unruh, Rick Belcher and Jeanine Corson.
 - b. Each Committee member picked their top two candidates and turned them in to Jeanine Corson
- 5. When setting up the 2nd round interviews, the top candidate who was located in California, dropped out.
- 6. It was decided that we would repost on April 1, 2024 to April 12, 2024.
- 7. Dr. Michelle Ginkins and Jeanine Corson reviewed all nineteen (19) on-line applications.
- 8. We chose twelve (12) applicants who met the requirements of this position.
- 9. We held our first round of interviews on April 25, 2024 and April 30, 2024. The following people served on the Interview Committee:
 - a. Dr. Michelle Ginkins, Dr. Travis Madison, Jamie Crick, Don Unruh, Rick Belcher and Jeanine Corson.
 - b. Each Committee member picked their top three candidates and turned them in to Jeanine Corson
- 10. After reviewing the information gathered from the Interview Committees and discussing the qualifications, experience, strengths, and area of concerns for all the candidates, we chose three candidates to return for a second round.

After reviewing the information gathered from the 1st and 2nd Interview Committees, reviewing their references and their vision and ideas for the Athletic department, Dr. Michelle Ginkins with the support of all committee members is recommending Shawn Garmon as the Athletic Director for NAHS.
